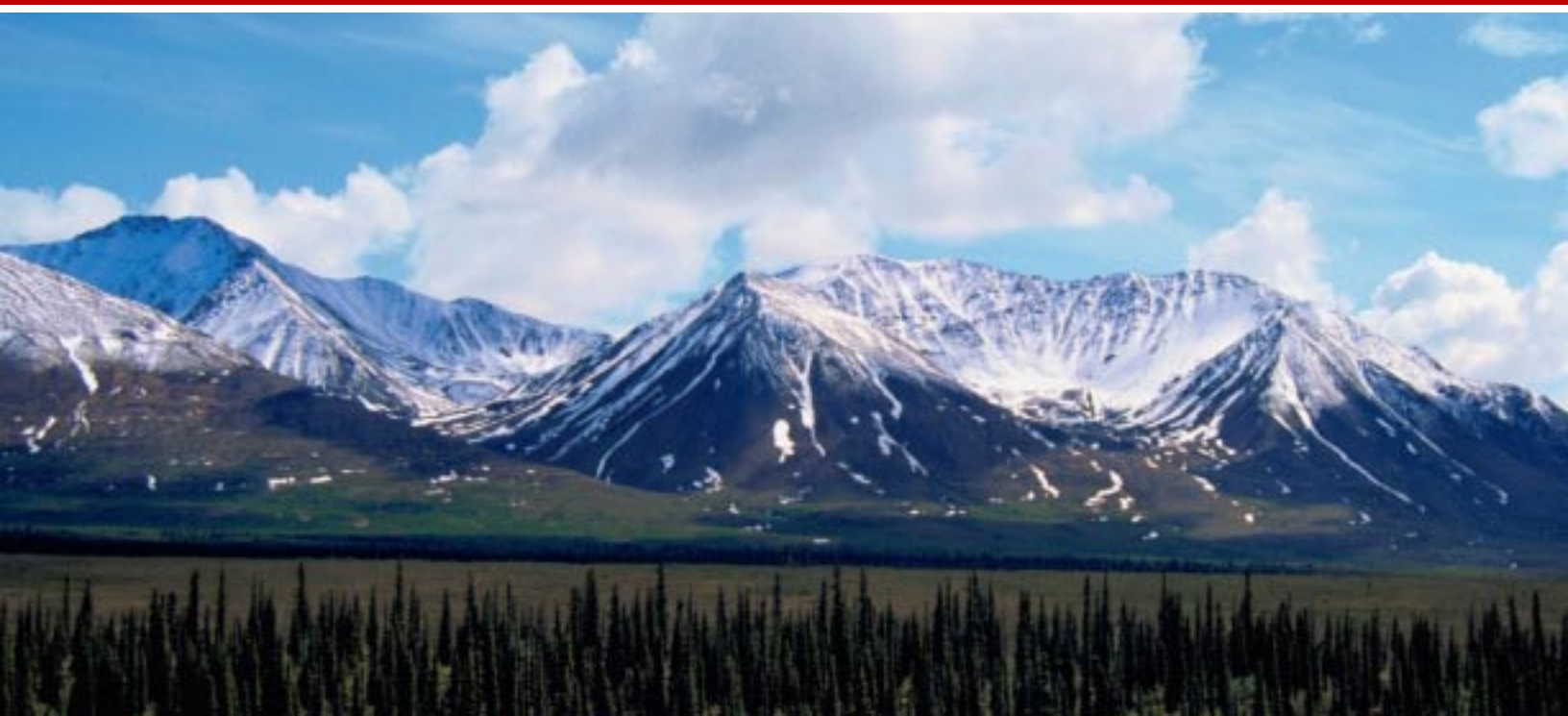

Ports of Call

05

01| Astoria, Oregon (Pacific Northwest)

Hundreds of Victorian homes line the picturebook hillsides of America's oldest settlement west of the Rockies. Take in a spectacular view of the city from the Astoria Column – see the surrounding bay, ocean, rivers and mountains.

Excursions include: Mt. Saint Helen's, Seafood Cooking School and Wine Tasting, and Flavel House Tea and Scones.

04| Ensenada, Mexico Departure Port (Pacific Northwest)

The Riviera Pacifica home to the Bar of the Seven Sins, boasts a colorful past as the former playground of California gentry and movie stars. Festive shops and a former prison that now serves as an Aztec Museum are just a couple of the highlights of this Baja Peninsula favorite.

07| Inside Passage, Alaska Scenic Cruising (Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound / Southbound Glacier, Pacific Northwest, Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

This is one of the most famously beautiful passages in all of the world. It features virtually everything you came to Alaska hoping to see, including rain forests, glaciers, fjords and white-capped peaks. All of which create a setting that's perfect for viewing whales and sea lions.

10| Los Angeles, California Departure Port (Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

Rodeo Drive, Spago, Mann's Chinese Theater, Sunset Boulevard – there's so much to see and do in L.A. you'll have to be judicious with your time. Shop with the stars, visit a studio back lot, or be a part of a studio audience for your favorite television show.

02| Campbell River, British Columbia, Canada (Pacific Northwest)

Campbell River boasts all five species of Pacific salmon in its protected waters. Enjoy the mild and refreshing breezes on Campbell River's seawalk, where you might spot a salmon, seal, eagle, or even a whale.

05| Hubbard Glacier, Alaska Scenic Cruising (Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound/ Southbound Glacier, Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

Hubbard Glacier is the one glacier in the world that does not move at a glacial pace. Quite the opposite. In fact, in 1986, Hubbard Glacier – the largest tidewater glacier on the North American continent – moved an average of just under 5.5 feet per hour. Keep a watchful eye as you sail through the Yakutat Bay; you may be a witness to geological history.

08| Juneau, Alaska (Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound/ Southbound Glacier, Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

Alaska's capital city boasts Mendenhall Glacier, a meandering river of compressed blue that is 1.5 miles wide and hundreds of feet thick. It's fed by a 1,500-square-mile ice field located outside Juneau.

Excursions include: Glacier Dogsled Adventure via Helicopter, Whale-Watching & Orca Point Lodge, and Mendenhall Glacier Float Trip.

11| Nanaimo, British Columbia, Canada (Pacific Northwest)

Right in the center of Vancouver Island, Nanaimo is often called a shopping mecca. Surrounded by endless evergreens, the city offers an array of heritage walks, gallery tours, and celebrated West Coast cuisine.

Excursions include: Cathedral Grove and Wildlife Recovery Center, Vancouver Island Ancient Forest and Waterfalls, Horne Lake Cave Exploring.

03| Catalina Island, California (Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

Visible from the California mainland, Catalina has long been a favorite retreat for Hollywood's elite. The boutiques in Avalon and an abundance of recreational activities, both on land and in the water, make Catalina a year-round playground.

Excursions include: Ocean Eco-Rafting, Lovers Cove Snorkel Tour, and Catalina Kayak Expedition.

06| Icy Strait Point, Alaska (Northbound/Southbound Glacier, Ultimate Alaska)

Fifty miles west of Juneau and at the mouth of Glacier Bay lies historic Icy Strait Point. Travelers have the unique opportunity to experience Tlingit culture, superior wildlife-viewing opportunities, and years of Alaskan history.

Excursions include: Whale and Marine Mammals Cruise, Remote Bush Exploration & Brown Bear Search, Saltwater Salmon Fishing, Glacier Bay Flightseeing, ATV Expedition.

09| Ketchikan, Alaska (Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Southbound Glacier, Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)

Ketchikan is the ancestral home of the Tlingit Tribe, and the departure point for seaplane excursions bound for the wild 2.2 million acres of Misty Fjords National Monument Wilderness. Also visit the Saxman Native Totem Village, featuring the world's largest collection of totem poles.

Excursions include: Rain Forest Canoe Adventure, Misty Fjords Seaplane Adventure, Wilderness Exploration & Crab Feed, and Saxman Native Totem Village.

Ports of Call

12| Prince Rupert, British

Columbia, Canada
(Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Pacific Northwest)

Due in part to its status as one of the oldest continuously occupied regions of the world, Prince Rupert has developed a rather unique culture. A thriving arts community that has produced globally acclaimed artists makes this north coast enclave a stop worth making. Excursions include: North Coast Rail Explorer, Exchamsiks River Tour, Butze Rain Forest Walk.

15| Seward, Alaska

Departure Port
(Southbound Glacier)

Seward is a fishing village surrounded by the unrivaled beauty of the Kenai Wildlife Refuge, the Alaska Maritime National Refuge, Chugach National Forest and the Kenai Fjords National Park. As you might expect, opportunities for up-close and personal encounters with wildlife abound. The village is named after William Seward, the intrepid fellow who negotiated a two-cent-per-acre price on the purchase of Alaska from our neighbors to the west.

18| Vancouver, British Columbia,

Canada
Departure Port
**(Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound/
Southbound Glacier, Pacific Northwest,
Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)**

Every bit as cosmopolitan as Seattle, with a distinctive European flair, Vancouver is the Canadian jewel of Puget Sound. From the cobblestone streets of the Gastown district to Little Italy and Chinatown, Vancouver has a little something for everyone.

Excursions include: Vancouver Highlights with Airport drop-off (offered on day of disembarkation).

13| San Francisco, California

Departure Port
**(Pacific Northwest, Ultimate Alaska,
West Coast and Alaska)**

This metropolis by the bay has inspired songs and gold fever. And it's the gateway to America's wine empire. Culture, cuisine, and an undeniably California vibe make San Francisco one of the world's great cities.

Excursions include: San Francisco City Sightseeing, and Fisherman's Wharf Wax Museum.

16| Sitka, Alaska

**(Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound
Glacier, Ultimate Alaska, West Coast
and Alaska)**

An onion-domed Russian cathedral graces Castle Hill in this once-Czarist Russian empire. What is now the Sitka National Historical Park was the battlefield where Russians and Tlingits fought for their lives and their land.

Excursions include: Sea Otter & Wildlife Quest, Halibut Fishing, Sealife Discovery Semi-Submersible.

19| Victoria, British Columbia,

Canada
**(Pacific Northwest, Ultimate Alaska,
West Coast and Alaska)**

The capital of British Columbia is also its largest island. This seaside enclave and one-time British colony has retained much of its colonial splendor. You'll also enjoy a temperate climate, which makes it very convenient for exploring many museums, parks and golf courses.

Excursions include: Butchart Gardens Wine and Chocolate, Whale-Watching, Grand City Drive, and Craigdarroch Castle & Empress Tea.

14| Seattle, Washington

Departure Port
**(Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Pacific Northwest,
Ultimate Alaska, West Coast and Alaska)**

The Emerald City combines spectacular natural beauty and cosmopolitan flair as few places can. Seattle also offers up some of the best seafood anywhere along the Pacific Rim. Named after the great chief of the Suquamish Tribe, Seattle enjoys a fusion of American, Asian and Native American cultures.

Excursions include: Seattle Highlights and Space Needle with Airport drop-off (offered on day of disembarkation).

17| Skagway, Alaska

**(Alaska Hubbard Glacier, Northbound/
Southbound Glacier, Ultimate Alaska,
West Coast and Alaska)**

Skagway, with its saloons and dance-hall revues, has managed to preserve a strong connection to its historic Gold Rush days

Excursions include: White Pass Scenic Railroad, Salmon Bake & Gold Rush Trail Camp, Glacier Point Wilderness Safari, Pilot's Choice Glacier Explorer.

Alaska Cruisetour Destinations

Seward, Alaska

As you might expect, opportunities for up-close and personal encounters with wildlife abound in Seward because it's surrounded by some of nature's finest handiwork. The Kenai Wildlife Refuge, the Alaska Maritime National Refuge, Chugach National Forest and the Kenai Fjords National Park encircle this popular fishing village in a plush cocoon of wilderness.

Accommodations: The Seward Windsong Lodge offers impressive amenities and sits at the gateway to Kenai Fjords National Park. †

Talkeetna, Alaska

This town is one of the gateways to Denali National Park and is known as the staging area for beginning an ascent of mighty Mt. McKinley. Three glacier-fed rivers meet in this town—the Susitna, Chulitna and Talkeetna. Not only will you find some of the best trout and salmon fishing this side of the lower 48, but you can also take in the beauty of nature aboard a relaxing river float trip.

Accommodations: Only the view of the Alaska Range and Mt. McKinley from the back deck rivals the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge's 45-foot stone fireplace. †

Alyeska (Girdwood), Alaska

This once-thriving mining town is now a favorite among hikers and nature-watchers. Beginning at the foot of Mt. Alyeska, Girdwood's hiking trails meander through forests and wildflower meadows.

Accommodations: Surrounded by glaciers and mountains, the Alyeska Prince Resort features four-diamond amenities. †

Denali National Park, Denali, Alaska

Everything about Denali is big, from animal inhabitants like grizzlies, moose and caribou to North America's highest peak, the venerable Mt. McKinley. Denali is a popular destination for adventure-seekers and explorers who push the limits of human endurance.

Accommodations: The Grand Denali's mountain-bluff setting offers unsurpassed views of the Alaska Range and the Nenana River Canyon. †

Anchorage, Alaska

This is as close to a "big city" as it gets in Alaska. Home to half the population of the state, Anchorage's high-rises pale in comparison to nature's towering peaks in the surrounding countryside. Shopping, performing arts, museums and the Alaska Native Heritage Center all make Anchorage a must on any visit to the 49th state.

Accommodations: The Anchorage Downtown Marriott is right in the heart of the city, with convenient access to everything. †

Fairbanks, Alaska

Like many towns in Alaska, Fairbanks gained its renown mainly as a Gold Rush town. In fact, Fairbanks still has working gold mines and is home to the famous El Dorado Gold Mine. You can buy gold-nugget jewelry and native handicrafts, such as porcupine-quill jewelry.

Accommodations: Pike's Waterfront Lodge welcomes visitors with an inviting fireplace, rustic charm, and beautiful Alaskan art. †

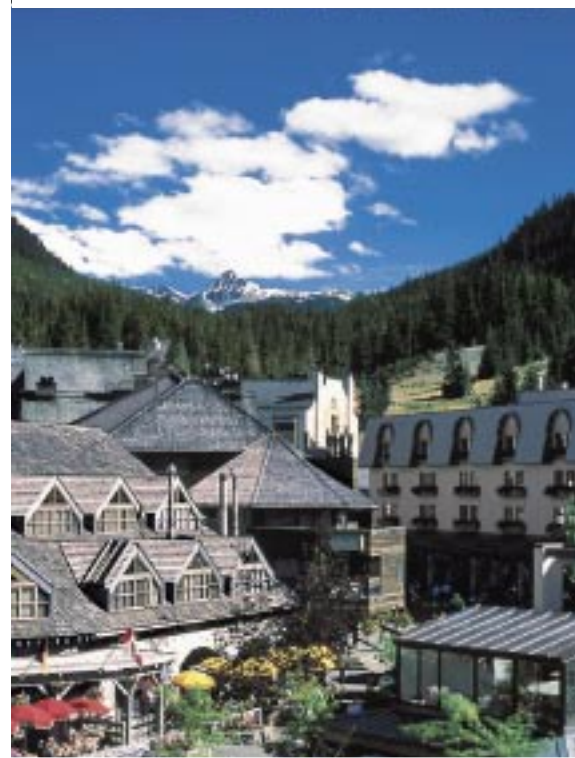

Shore Excursions

Sometimes who shows it to you is as important as what you see.

Think of a Celebrity ship as a moveable feast. And our shore excursions as something of a tasting menu—a buffet of cultural delicacies. Excursions with local guides can provide you with a colorful snapshot of the day-to-day life of a place. Plus its essential history and its geological wonders.

From Juneau, for example, take a helicopter trip that gives you an eagle’s-eye view of four separate glaciers and even an opportunity to walk on one. Or a float-plane trip to historic Taku Glacier Lodge for a feast of grilled king salmon.

Visitors going ashore at Icy Strait Point can take a remote bush hike to the Spasski River Valley, where they might see brown bears, bald eagles and other animals, and natural features. You may also opt to go flightseeing over Glacier Bay in a fixed-wing plane or whale-watching in search of humpback and orca whales.

In Canada’s British Columbia, guests can embark on an Ale Trail & Pub Tour in Victoria. Or explore the historic 39-room, stainedglass masterpiece, Craigdarroch Castle. Plus, the Empress Hotel, where guests can partake of tea in the hotel’s elegantly appointed lobby.

In Sitka, you can take a halibut-fishing trip on Sitka Sound. And your catch can be processed and shipped to your home. Alternatively, a shore excursion might involve a mini-cruise to photograph otters, whales, sea lions, porpoise, brown bears and eagles.

A shore excursion in Skagway may find you panning for gold and eating grilled Alaska salmon cooked over an open fire. If you’d rather see gold country from the comfort of a vintage-style parlor car, take the White Pass Scenic Railway to the top of a 2,865-foot summit for a breathtaking panorama of mountains, glaciers, gorges, waterfalls, tunnels, trestles and historic sites. For a little more physical activity, consider the Glacier Point Wilderness Safari. It starts with a boat ride through a fjord, then a short nature hike, and ends with a canoe trip among the icebergs.

In Ketchikan, you can visit the ancient totem poles at the Totem Heritage Center. Embark on a Misty Fjords Flightseeing trip, a float-plane trip that takes you flying over the nation’s secondlargest wilderness preserve. Or witness the Great Alaska Lumberjack Show, with events that include a pole climb that concludes with a breath-stealing 50-foot freefall.

Closer to home, a shore excursion in San Francisco might include a visit to Fisherman’s Wharf and Alcatraz before an afternoon of shopping in Sausalito.

These represent just a few of the shore excursions offered. But wherever you go and whichever you choose, they never fail to add a hint of spice, an unexpected thrill or a sublime sense of serenity to your travels.
