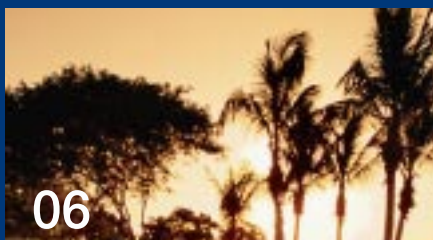

# Sun, Fun and So Much More

**You'll leave the Caribbean with a lot more than a healthy glow.**

Walk among the ruins and mingle with the ghosts of the fabled Mayans. It's thought that between 200 A.D. and 950 A.D., Belize was the heart of Mayan civilization, but it is from Honduras that you'll be able to visit archeological sites and museums dedicated to furthering your insight into this incredible culture and people. You can even explore modern-day representations of their villages, where you'll learn how Mayan methods of harvesting palm thatch resulted in roof structures that lasted up to twenty-five years, an enviable feat even in modern times, let alone over a thousand years ago.

For those who love wildlife, the islands of the Caribbean offer countless subjects to appreciate, in the water, on land and in the air. The warm, shallow waters provide a perfect habitat for unique coral reefs, home to gorgeous and interesting marine life. They are also ideal shelter for a variety of turtles. (Grand Cayman has a wonderful giant sea-turtle habitat.) If you've never tried snorkeling, it's an easy skill to learn, and the payoff is breathtaking. For divers, it gets even better, with thrills like wreck-diving off the coasts of Barbados and Grand Cayman.

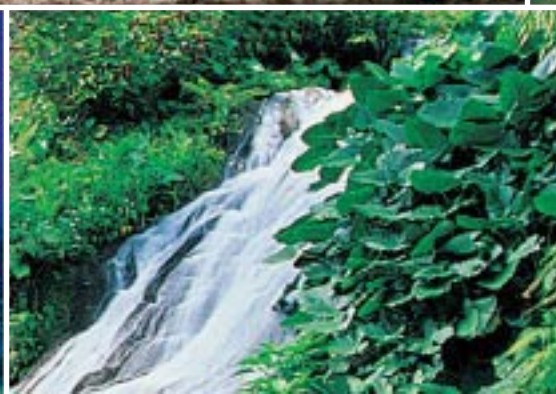
From Puerto Limón, Costa Rica, you can visit Tortuguero, one of the best places to see nature's diversity. One trip down the canals might include seeing caimans, sloths, different kinds

of monkeys, and sea otters, just to name a few. Birders won't be disappointed either. In addition to toucans at Tortuguero, you'll find the Caribbean is a haven for birdwatchers. Sanctuaries can be found on many islands, and most feature species endemic to that region.

Outdoor enthusiasts will discover there's no end to the possibilities in the Caribbean. Take a hike up Jamaica's Dunn's River Falls, perhaps the only river walk in the world that has you actually walking, from start to finish, in a river. Don't forget to explore Barbados, with its magnificent flower forests and historic 18th-century sugarcane plantations and mills. St. Lucia will have you marveling at its towering twin conical peaks and simmering volcanic vents. And trekking through the environmentally pristine rain forests of Costa Rica is a treat for all your senses.

And then there's shopping. The boutiques of St. Maarten always serve up a warm island welcome to the world of French couture. Find a bargain (or many) in St. Thomas. Visit the artist village of Altos de Chavón in the Dominican Republic and find a bit of the Caribbean to display back home.

The Caribbean's main attractions just might be the sun, surf and sand. But if you have the energy to dig a little deeper, there's always something exciting to do in the Caribbean.

# Ports of call

## 01 | Basseterre, St. Kitts

(Eastern, Exotic, Southern and Ultimate Caribbean)

With a town square fashioned after London's Piccadilly Circus, St. Kitts blends the gentrified feel of a European capital with island ease. The ultimate in laid-back luxury, St. Kitts has attracted some of the world's most discerning travelers.

**Excursions include:** Two-Tank Boat Dive and St. Kitts Scenic Railway Tour.

## 04 | Cape Liberty, New Jersey

(Departure Port)

This cruise port, the first in New Jersey in 40 years, offers guests outstanding views of the harbor, the Verrazano-Narrows Bridge, the Statue of Liberty and lower Manhattan.

## 07 | Charleston, South Carolina

(Eastern Caribbean)

If there's a city in America that exemplifies the tradition of Southern hospitality, it's Charleston – consistently rated one of America's friendliest cities. Its magnificently preserved antebellum mansions, horse-drawn carriages and easy grace make this one of the most welcoming ports in the United States, if not the world.

**Excursions include:** Historic Charleston, Charleston Walking Tour and Charleston Carriage Ride.

## 10 | Costa Maya, Mexico

(Exotic Caribbean)

A short sail from the resort life of Cozumel brings you to an often-overlooked world of history and tradition. Costa Maya is a treasure of Mayan ruins, ancient forts and villages nestled into a lagoon-laced landscape. This panorama is waiting patiently for the next Renoir or Georgia O'Keefe to immortalize it.

**Excursions include:** Dune Buggy Jungle & Beach Safari and Chacchoben Mayan Ruins.

## 02 | Bridgetown, Barbados

(Exotic, Southern and Ultimate Caribbean)

Barbados has been dubbed "Little England" because of assets like its Victorian architecture, museums chronicling the island's history, and the continental tradition of high tea. All of this lends an unmistakable sense of dignity to Barbados, with the added benefit of a Caribbean climate and unique island hospitality.

**Excursions include:** Beautiful Barbados & Colonial Plantation House and Barbados Catamaran Sail & Snorkel.

## 05 | Castries, St. Lucia

(Southern and Ultimate Caribbean)

St. Lucia is one of the most ruggedly beautiful islands in all the Caribbean. Its famous twin peaks are among the most startling geological formations in the world. The island's coral reefs and powdery beaches make it a dreamland for snorkelers and beachgoers alike.

**Excursions include:** North Coast & Beach Tour.

## 08 | CocoCay® Bahamas

(Exotic and Caribbean Highlights)

Some people seek inner peace through yoga or meditation. A few fortunate individuals visit CocoCay.® This is a place made for lounging, lifting your face to the sun and worrying about nothing. Visitors may tour a replica of Blackbeard's ship, jet-ski or simply relax in the warm, gentle and restorative surf.

**Excursions include:** Sea Trek Snorkeling on CocoCay,® Sea Trek Parasailing and Sea Trek Aqua Park – Caylana's Castle Cove.

## 11 | Cozumel, Mexico

(Caribbean Highlights, Ultimate and Western Caribbean)

Cozumel has been called the gem of the Mexican Caribbean. Located twelve miles east of the Yucatán Peninsula, its astonishing coral reefs make Cozumel an underwater sanctuary for hundreds of exotic fish species, a true mecca for divers and a highlight for any visitor to the Caribbean.

**Excursions include:** Tulum Mayan Ruins Express and Cancún Shopping & Beach Tour.

## 03 | Charlotte Amalie, St. Thomas

(Caribbean Highlights, Eastern, Exotic,

Southern and Ultimate Caribbean) St. Thomas must be regarded as the Caribbean's premier marketplace. Duty-free bargains are found everywhere. Shop for a coral sculpture for the coffee table, the Swiss watch you've always wanted, or simply a bottle of island rum to share with friends who are waiting at home to hear the story of your travels. If you're shopping for a bit of local history, visit Bluebeard's Castle in downtown Charlotte Amalie.

**Excursions include:** St. Thomas Sightseeing Tour.

## 06 | Catalina Island/Casa de Campo, Dominican republic

(Eastern Caribbean)

Centuries-old cobblestone streets, modern golf facilities and the artist colony of Altos de Chavón make Casa de Campo, acre for acre, one of the most colorful and diverse stops on your journey.

**Excursions include:** Water Eco Adventure, Countryside Tour and Kandela Latin Extravaganza.

## 09 | Colón, Panama

(Exotic, Ultimate and Western Caribbean)

If you were to make a list of true historic and engineering milestones, the Panama Canal would surely be one of them. A trip to Colón delivers you to the mouth of the canal on its eastern end. It also provides a glimpse of the world's largest man-made lake, lying just beyond the Gatún Locks.

**Excursions include:** Grand Tour of Panama, Panama Canal Locks.

## 12|Ft. Lauderdale, Florida

(Departure Port)

Those who think Ft. Lauderdale stands in the shadow of Miami are in for a very pleasant surprise. The city has matured into a gracious destination with sophisticated cuisine, nightclubs and a personality all its own. The restaurants and shopping on Las Olas Boulevard and Himmarshee alone offer proof that Ft. Lauderdale has blossomed into something truly special, all while retaining a certain measure of its youthful spirit.

## 15|Key West, Florida

(Bermuda/Caribbean, Caribbean Highlights, Eastern, Exotic, Ultimate and Western Caribbean)

Key West offers a perspective on life that's different from anyplace else in the U.S. It was home to Ernest Hemingway and rumrunners. Every night, natives and visitors alike gather on Mallory Docks to pay homage to the most glorious sunsets you may ever experience.

**Excursions include:** Key West Homes & Gardens Tour and Boat & Kayak Eco Adventure.

## 18|Margarita Island, Venezuela

(Southern Caribbean)

Margarita is known as the "Pearl of the Caribbean," and you'll soon understand why. Long stretches of unspoiled beaches, friendly locals and water so clear that snorkelers can easily spot lobsters frolicking beneath the waves from fifteen feet above. This is one of the hardest places in the Caribbean to leave behind.

## 21|Nassau, Bahamas

(Eastern Caribbean)

Very few sounds in this world are capable of transporting you to another place like the sound of Bahamas' steel drums. Their beat announces that you are officially away. Bahamas' shops, fine dining and some of the most swim-friendly waters anywhere also convince you that this is the place you've been dreaming about.

**Excursions include:** Nassau and Paradise Island Tour, Stingray Snorkeling & Beach Break and Glass-Bottom-Boat Tour.

## 13|George Town, Grand Cayman

(Caribbean Highlights, Exotic, Ultimate and Western Caribbean)

Once a hideout for some of the most notorious pirates in history, Grand Cayman is now host to visitors eager to peer into the almost extraterrestrial world of Stingray City. National Geographic named swimming among the rays as one of the most rewarding experiences in the undersea world.

**Excursions include:** Turtle Farm and Colony Beach Club, Nautilus Undersea Tour & Reef Snorkel and Seaworld Explorer Glass-Bottom Boat.

## 16|King's Wharf, Bermuda

(Bermuda/Caribbean)

Perched on the tip of Bermuda's West End, King's Wharf is home to an impressive Royal Navy Dockyard and a crafts market, where local artists display their wares. Nearby, Somerset Village boasts the world's smallest drawbridge, opening a mere 22 inches – just wide enough to accommodate a sailboat's mast.

## 19|Montego Bay, Jamaica

(Western Caribbean)

With open-air markets, resorts and an eclectic mix of personalities, Montego Bay is a good place to immerse yourself in local culture. Sidewalk domino games, shopping arcades like St. James and Fantasy Plazas, and the world-famous Doctor's Cave Beach, which is fed by mineral springs, all await the eager explorer.

**Excursions include:** Rose Hall Great House, Jungle River Tubing, Appleton Estate Rum Tour and Essence of Montego Highlights.

## 22|Ocho Rios, Jamaica

(Exotic and Western Caribbean)

For many guests on a Celebrity cruise, the path to happiness leads straight through a river – Dunn's River Falls. Guides lead you upstream via a series of limestone steps hidden beneath the rushing water, stopping along the way for an occasional dip in one of the Falls' clear, terraced pools.

**Excursions include:** Ocho Rios Highlights and Dunn's River Falls, The Best of Ocho Rios and Bob Marley Bus Tour.

## 14|Grand Bahama Island

(Caribbean Highlights, Special Caribbean)

With its winding paths, gorgeous waterfalls and over 10,000 species of exotic plants, nature lovers shouldn't miss a visit to Garden of the Groves. Birders visiting Grand Bahama Island will have the opportunity to view 18 Bahamian birds not seen in the U.S., Canada or Europe. When you're finished, enjoy a conch fritter as you explore the duty-free shops in Port Lucaya Marketplace.

## 17|Labadee® Hispaniola

(Exotic Caribbean)

Hispaniola is a mountainous island, blanketed in tropical foliage and exotic vegetation. While the island may serve as a picturesque playground for water-lovers, it's also easy to find places that make you feel as if this were your own private natural kingdom.

## 20|Miami, Florida

(Departure Port)

From the chic elite of South Beach to the sparkling beaches and nightlife that never sleeps, Miami is sure to deliver excitement. But it's also a city rich in heritage and diversity. So if your pace is a little more relaxed, you'll have lots of options to choose from.

## 23|Oranjestad, Aruba

(Bermuda/Caribbean, Caribbean Highlights, Southern and Ultimate Caribbean)

Aruba's capital city embodies a blend of Dutch and Caribbean culture, which can be found in everything from the cuisine to the architecture. The charming boutiques and tropical gardens illustrate its European influences.

**Excursions include:** Aruba Town & Countryside Drive and Sunset Catamaran Cruise.

## 26|Roatán, Honduras

(Exotic and Western Caribbean)

Roatán's beaches remind you of a picturepostcard Caribbean. But as with most things, Roatán's true beauty lies under the surface. Its coral reef, mystical wrecks and bountiful sealife have made it a diver's haven, on par with the world's great dive sites.

**Excursions include:** Dolphin Encounter, West Bay Kayak & Snorkel and Sailing Yacht Adventure.

## 29|St. George's, Grenada

(Exotic Caribbean)

Despite Grenada's awesome beauty, the most powerful memory you may carry home with you is the bouquet of the island. The spice plantations, sugarcane fields, and rum distillers give Grenada a trademark aroma and character. What's more, you can tour the plantations and distilleries that have played such a colorful part in the region's lore.

**Excursions include:** Full Day Sightseeing with Lunch, Whale and Dolphin Spotting and East Coast Drive

## 32|Tortola, B.V.

(Eastern Caribbean)

## 24|Philipsburg, St. Maarten

## 27|Roseau, Dominica

(Southern Caribbean)

The capital city of this still largely untouched island is a haven for nature-lovers. You may enjoy hiking through the lush and dense landscape, stopping along the way to enjoy the waterfalls, clear rivers and hot springs. Roseau is also a great place for a scuba-diving adventure.

## 30|St. John's, Antigua

(Caribbean Highlights and Southern Caribbean)

St. John's features 365 different beaches. Fortunately, the quantity has most assuredly not compromised quality. With options that range from secluded coves to some of the most interesting people-watching beaches in the region, it practically guarantees that every visitor will find the exact beach to suit every whim.

**Excursions include:** Antigua Island & Historical Tour and Helicopter to Montserrat Volcano.

## 33|Willemstad, Curaçao

(Bermuda/Caribbean, Caribbean Highlights and Southern Caribbean)

A drive over the fabled Queen Juliana Bridge, 185 feet above the turquoise waters of the Caribbean, presents one of the most breathtaking views of this former Dutch colony. The island's abundance of forts belies its warm, welcoming nature, as you'll discover on a trip to the Old Market. There, you can mingle with the local shoppers and fishmongers, and even enjoy some fresh grilled fish.

**Excursions include:** Curaçao Highlights Tour, Curaçao Snorkeling Tour and Tram Tour of Otrobanda.

## 25|Puerto Limón, Costa Rica

(Exotic, Ultimate and Western Caribbean)

When it comes to preserving the environment and protecting its natural resources, Costa Rica may be the most passionate and successful nation on earth. Bird sanctuaries and vast protected areas offer visitors an increasingly rare glimpse of virgin forests, and endangered plant and animal species.

**Excursions include:** Full Day to San José, Costa Rica Off-Road Adventure and Banana Plantation & Coastal Highlights

## 28|San Juan, Puerto Rico

(Caribbean Highlights, Eastern, Exotic and Southern Caribbean)

San Juan has two distinct personalities. It's a vibrant, modern port city, yet it also clings to its rich history as a colonial outpost, conquered by Juan Ponce de León in 1508. This is a city that wears its Spanish heritage proudly in its museums, forts and cathedrals.

**Excursions include:** Old and New San Juan City Tour and Seven Seas Kayak.

## 31|Tampa, Florida

(Departure Port)

Originally a sponge-fishing center for Greek immigrants and a haven for Cuban exiles, Tampa has grown into a truly world-class city. Its soaring commercial center, museums, and palm-lined neighborhoods and amusement parks (including Busch Gardens) make this one of the most livable cities in America. And certainly one of the most delightful for visitors.



# Shore Excursions

**You'll leave the Caribbean with a lot more than a healthy glow.**

Shore excursions can provide you with a colorful snapshot of day-to-day life, the essential history and the natural wonders of Caribbean destinations. They allow you to experience specific things that interest you. They're truly a worry-free way to get the most out of your time on land.

The Garifuna & Mangrove Tunnels shore excursion takes you to Yubu to watch the traditional dances of the Garifuna, performed here since 1797 by descendants of African slaves. You'll also get to watch cassava bread being made on a mud stove, basket weavers at work and wood carvings created before your eyes.

Or visit Jonesville, a stilt-village where you will board a motorized dory for a trip through the reef-protecting mangrove tunnels. Here, red mangroves form a canopy that covers the canal from Jonesville to Caribe Point Bight, a 30-minute round-trip by boat. This excursion in Roatán, Honduras, provides great photo opportunities from hilltops, beaches and among the mangroves.

In Puerto Limón, Costa Rica, choose the Costa Flores Tropical Flowers Garden excursion to explore one of the largest tropical flower and palm farms in the world. It covers 300 acres, with over 600 varieties of tropical flowers and palms. Several rain and humid forests border the farm, which has been fertilized for thousands of years by Costa Rica's rich volcanic soil. Plus, there are lots of shore excursion opportunities if you're looking for adventure, including the Loterie Farm

Treetop Adventure Tour in St. Maarten. It takes you soaring between the tops of majestic 200-year-old mango and mahogany trees via zip-lines, rope swings and bridges suspended from platforms mounted in the trees of the forest. It's the most exhilarating way to experience the rich biodiversity of St. Maarten's only rainforest microclimate (home to the largest bird habitat in the northeastern Caribbean).

For all of the thrill in a different setting, Panama's Monkey Watch is an invigorating 30-minute ride at high speed right through the heart of the Panama Canal. You'll slow down to enter the labyrinth of jungle-covered islands of Lake Gatún. In this protected area, the wildlife is plentiful, and you're likely to encounter capuchin monkeys, 3-toed sloth, howler monkeys, various kinds of toucans and other bird life, as well as crocodiles, turtles and a wealth of butterflies. This is an exceptional place to experience the sights and sounds of the jungle up close.

These are just a few of the dozens of shore excursions offered as part of Celebrity's Caribbean. Our goal is to make sure you find even more than you hoped for as you decide how to experience the Caribbean.
