Or travel to Helsinki to study the neoclassical architecture in Senate Square. And then to Glasgow, Scotland, known for its Victorian-era buildings.

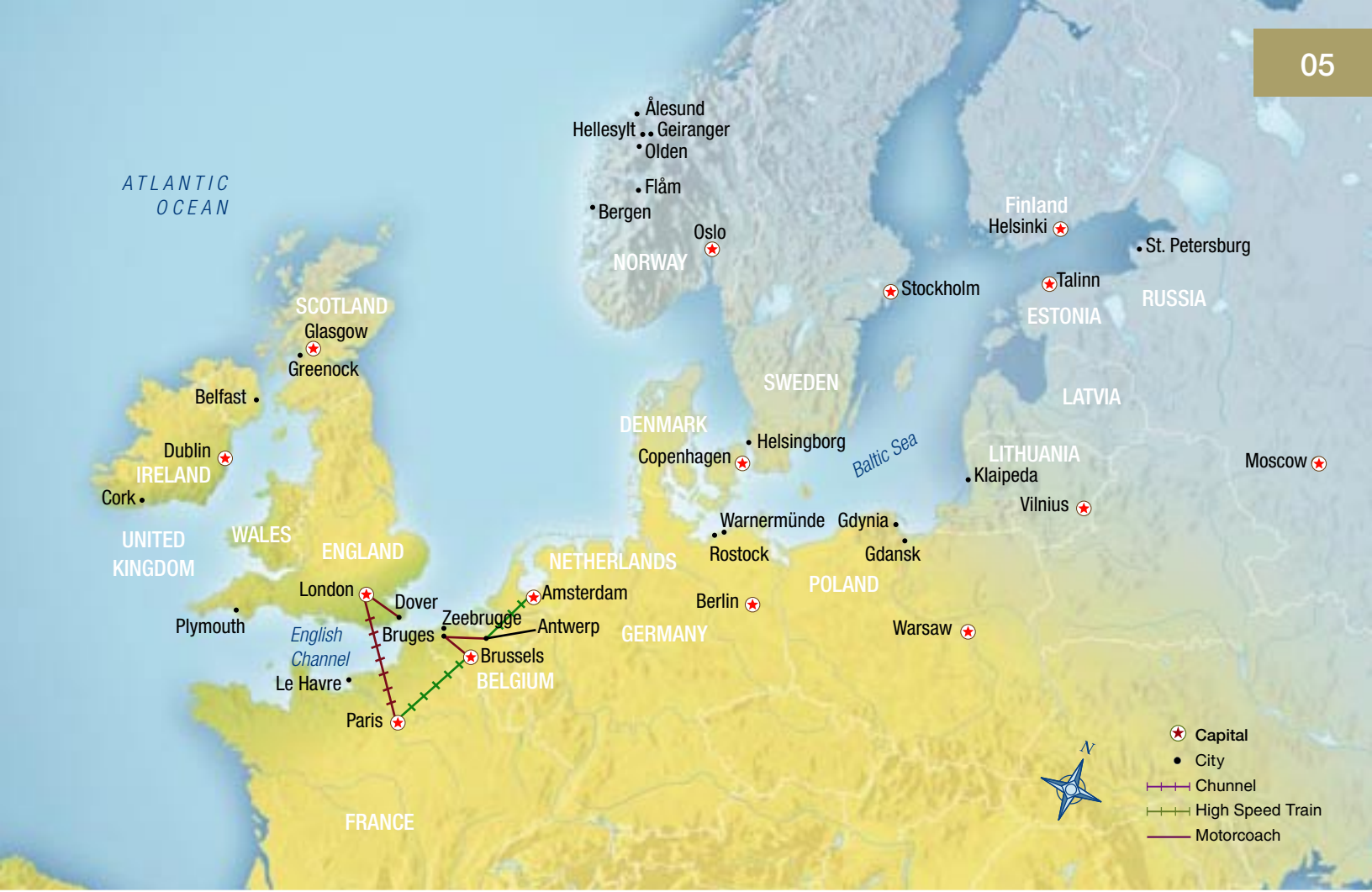

# Ports of call

## 01 | Ålesund, Norway

Ålesund's architecture is known far and wide. Turrets, spires, and other whimsical art nouveau architectural touches give the town its distinctive, fairy tale-like character. The scenic spectacle of the Geiranger Fjord, one of Norway's best-known attractions, is just a stone's throw from this quaint little town.

**Excursions include:** Saga Islands & Atlantic Sea Park, and The Path of the Trolls.

## 04 | Bergen, Norway

Once the seat of medieval Norway, Bergen is a former Viking stronghold girded by deep fjords, towering mountains and sweeping glaciers. Visit Bryggen Wharf, where you can strike a bargain in one of the many artisans' workshops, or visit the famous Fish Market, climb Mt. Floien or take in a Trolldaugen Concert.

**Excursions include:** Bergen City & Trolldaugen Concert, and Hiking Mount Floien.

## 07 | Cork, Ireland

(City of Interest)

Navigate Cork's hilly streets and discover the affable melody of Ireland's most talkative citizenry. Regarded as Ireland's most charming people, Corkians have a way of making everyone feel like part of the family. In between conversations, visit local artisans and witness their skills in the arts of weaving and cutting crystal.

**Excursions include:** Waterford, the Viking Capital of Ireland, Blarney Castle & Panoramic Cork, and Titanic Walking & Heritage Trail.

## 10 | Flåm, Norway

You'll find the beautiful small town of Flåm nestled deep in a tributary of the world's longest and deepest fjord. Surrounded by steep mountainsides, roaring waterfalls and deep valleys, you'll experience a one-of-a-kind experience with nature. Its almost 65-year-old Flåm Railway is widely known as one of the world's most fantastic stretches of railroad.

## 02 | Amsterdam, Netherlands

(Departure Port)

Amsterdam is a funky mix of old and new, coffee shops and concentric canals. It's a blend of cultures, but still quintessentially Dutch. The people-watching is rewarding, and the quest for rich history is even more so. Take a boat tour along the canals to enjoy the distinct and beautiful personalities of the many bridges you'll see.

**Excursions include:** Walking Tour & Canal Cruise, Amsterdam Sightseeing & Canal Cruise, Windmills & Edam, and Voldendam & Market.

## 05 | Berlin, Germany

(City of Interest)

Reunited and today one of Europe's most vital centers of art and culture, Berlin houses more than 170 museums as well as a dynamic range of cultural and architectural gems, from the Brandenburg Gate and summer palace of Queen Sophie Charlotte to the engrossing tribute to Berlin's Jewish quarter.

**Excursions include:** Berlin Cultural Treasures, Berlin's Jewish History & Story, and Savory Bites & Brewery.

## 08 | Dover, England

(Departure Port)

Cut by wind and sea over the past 100 million years, the White Cliffs of Dover stand as a symbol of England's legendary strength and character. Among Dover's attractions are the massive Dover Castle and the unique archeological site of The Roman Painted House, uncovered by a road crew in 1970, 28 feet underground.

**Excursions include:** London Panoramic Sightseeing & Heathrow Airport Transfer, and Royal Windsor & Heathrow Transfer.

## 11 | Gdansk, Poland

(City of Interest)

This medieval city's prime location along the Baltic Sea has made it one of the leading ports in central Europe. In Gdansk, you'll find 1,000-year-old monuments and buildings that have been resurrected from near ruin and returned to their original splendor. One section of town that never needs reviving, however, is the vibrant and bustling Long Market, center of historic Gdansk.

**Excursions include:** Malbork Castle, Gdansk & Oliwa Cathedral, and Leisurely Gdansk.

## 03 | Belfast, Northern Ireland

This vibrant, fast-moving city includes a fabulous dining scene, an active arts movement, and wonderful sightseeing and shopping – all on a walkable scale. Belfast is also known for its many Victorian and Edwardian buildings complete with elaborate sculptures and stone-carved heads of gods, poets, scientists, kings and queens.

**Excursions include:** Belfast – Past, Present & Future, Mount Stewart House & Gardens, and Giant's Causeway & Antrim Coast.

## 06 | Copenhagen, Denmark

Whether strolling through a sea of blooming flowers in Tivoli Gardens, witnessing the changing of the guard at Amalienborg Palace, or touring Kronberg Castle – the setting of Shakespeare's Hamlet – it's easy to see why this once-humble fishing village grew to become the capital of Denmark.

**Excursions include:** Copenhagen by Bicycle, Royal Copenhagen, and Charming Copenhagen Walk & Cruise.

## 09 | Dublin, Ireland

With Dublin Bay to the east and the Dublin Mountains to the south, the capital of Ireland has clearly left quite an impression on the surrounding lands. As you explore the medieval streets around Dublin Castle and duck in for a tasty pint served up at Keating's Pub, you're certain to enjoy many great conversations speckled with famous Irish wit.

**Excursions include:** Malahide Castle & Irish Pub, and Panoramic Dublin, Irish Countryside & Glendalough.

## 12 | Gdynia, Poland

(Gateway Port to Gdansk, Poland) Gdynia is a young, dynamic place with a thriving arts scene. It's often referred to as Poland's "Window to the World" because of its status as a major seaport. Gdynia is also Seattle's international "Sister City."

## 13|Geiranger, Norway

Where Norwegians escape when they need a vacation. The most breathtaking attraction in Geiranger – and there are many – is the mighty Seven Sisters Waterfall, spilling hundreds of thousands of gallons of water from an incredible height of 5,000 feet. Sitting at the head of majestic Geiranger Fjord, the city is surrounded by towering snow-covered mountain peaks, lush, green vegetation and winding hiking trails for the ambitious vacationer.

## 16|Hellesylt, Norway

For one of the tiniest cities in Norway, Hellesylt may have the greatest feast for your eyes. This pearl of the fjords rests on the head of the Sunnlyvsfjord. Not far from the village of Hellesylt, a glacier-fed rivulet plummets thousands of feet off a sheer granite face, the sky arcing with breathtaking rainbows.

## 19|Klaipeda, Lithuania

On the Baltic Sea and the Curonian Lagoon, Klaipeda is Lithuania's third-largest city and the capital of West Lithuania. Stroll past the brightly colored buildings on Market Street and visit the Lithuanian Sea Museum and Aquarium, housed in a 19th-century military fortress.

**Excursions include:** Coastal Dunes & Bird Paradise, and Village Life in Lithuania.

## 22|Oslo, Norway

Sail across the Oslo Fjord, and you sail back in time to 1050 A.D. This capital city's lavish history can be uncovered at the Viking Ship Museum and the Kon-Tiki Museum, which serves as home to the Fram, a famous polar-exploration ship. Cross the drawbridge to the formerly impenetrable Akershus Castle and meander through the famous Vigeland Sculpture Park before returning to the present day.

**Excursions include:** Hiking in the Nordmarka Forest, Hadeland Glassworks & Viking Ships, and Scenic Oslo by Coach.

## 14|Glasgow, Scotland

(City of Interest)

Occupying both sides of the River Clyde in the Central Lowlands is the cosmopolitan center of Scotland. Although recently reborn as a modern-day metropolis rife with the art nouveau architecture of Charles Rennie Mackintosh, Glasgow is also well known for its stunning Victorian-era buildings.

**Excursions include:** Loch Lomond – Pedal & Paddle, Stirling Castle, and Glasgow City Walk, Pub with Fish & Chips.

## 17|Helsingborg, Sweden

Wander through the recently restored Sofiero Castle, built in 1885 by Crown Prince Oscar and his wife, Sofia. The grounds are known for their gorgeous rhododendrons. You won't want to leave without visiting "The Keep," one of the most important medieval monuments in Sweden, and the symbol of Helsingborg.

**Excursions include:** Kullen Lighthouse & Caves, Kingdom of Ceramics, and Helsingborg Walking Tour.

## 20|Le Havre, France

(Gateway Port to Paris, France)

At the mouth of the Seine River, you'll find Le Havre, a French port that will capture you the very moment you set eyes on it. Some say that from Le Havre they can hear Paris and see the beaches of Normandy beckon.

**Excursions include:** The Beaches of Normandy, Mont Saint Michel, Versailles Palace & Gardens, and Paris Sightseeing with Lunch Cruise.

## 23|Paris, France

(City of Interest)

All that you've heard is true. Paris is simply one of the most beautiful cities in the world. Here, your Tour Director will take you to countless attractions and points of interest. See the Louvre museum, take a romantic stroll along the Champs Élysées, or visit Notre Dame. The gleaming city of Paris has, without question, earned its nickname: "The City of Light."

## 15|Greenock, Scotland

(Gateway Port to Glasgow, Scotland)

The port city of Greenock may well have you wishing you'd brought along an extra roll of film. Your passage to Glasgow begins here, on the coast of picturesque central Scotland.

**Excursions include:** Royal Yacht Britannia & Panoramic Edinburgh, and Panoramic Scottish Lochs.

## 18|Helsinki, Finland

Occupying a peninsula and several islands, this capital city's stunning meld of old and new structures rings some of the most spectacular bays you could ever hope to find. Stroll down broad, tree-lined streets, or take in the amazing neoclassically designed architecture in Senate Square.

**Excursions include:** Steam Train & Helsinki Highlights, Porvoo & Helsinki Highlights, and Glimpse of Old Town Porvoo.

## 21|Olden, Norway

Much of Olden looks as though it's straight out of the 17th century, so make sure to spend time exploring the town's many historic sites.

**Excursions include:** Briksdalen Glacier, Fjaerland & the Norwegian Glacier Center, and Cruise on Lake Loen.

## 24|Ringaskiddy, Ireland

(Gateway Port to Cork, Ireland)

In 1804, residents of this fishing village built the Martello Tower to protect this important harbor from Napoleon's advancing army. Today, Ringaskiddy is a hospitable stop on your way to Cork and Kerry. Blarney and the Blarney Stone are just a few miles away.

# Ports of call

## 25 | Rostock, Germany

(City of Interest)

Rostock was founded on an old Slavic fortress on the Warnow River estuary. Interesting historical structures include the 13th-century Church of St. Mary and portions of the medieval city walls and gates. The oldest university in Northern Europe was founded in Rostock in 1419.

## 26 | Stockholm, Sweden

No fewer than fifty bridges connect this Swedish capital's fourteen islands to its mainland. Undoubtedly, so Swedes can enjoy every inch of this magnificent city. Visit the many parks, museums, and palaces – most famous, the 600-room Royal Palace. Make your way through Gamla Stan, or Old Town, packed with historic buildings, shops and cafés.

**Excursions include:** Medieval Stockholm, The Icebar & Old Town, and Stockholm & Vasa Museum.

## 27 | St. Petersburg, Russia

St. Petersburg was reportedly built to resemble such western cities as London, Paris and Vienna. Though once you see its regal palaces and many vast public squares, you'll agree there's nothing quite like it. If you're fortunate enough to be in St. Petersburg in June, revel in the city's famous "white nights," when the boundless night sky is never completely dark.

**Excursions include:** Journey to Moscow, Grand St. Petersburg with Hermitage, and St. Petersburg Cathedrals.

## 28 | Tallinn, Estonia

Tallinn has remained remarkably unchanged since its founding in 1154 A.D. The preservation of this city's Old World charm enables visitors to enjoy architectural marvels of centuries past, such as the soaring towers of Toompea Castle and the exquisite Russian Orthodox Cathedral. The exception is the delightfully modern pink Parliament building, visible from Palace Square.

**Excursions include:** Countryside Cycling & Old Town Walking, Tallinn Walking Tour, and Panoramic Tallinn.

## 29 | Warnemünde, Germany

(Gateway Port to Berlin/Rostock)

Located at the mouth of the Warnow River, Warnemünde is a charming old fishing town, where they say your chances of catching a fish are just as good as your chances of catching a ride to historic Berlin.

**Excursions include:** Cycling in Warnemünde, and Warnemünde on Foot & Miniature Train.

## 30 | Zeebrugge, Belgium

(Gateway Port to Brussels)

Bordering the delta of the Scheldt, and the Maas and Rhine rivers, Zeebrugge could be one of the most unique seaports you visit in this lifetime. It's blessed with a picturesque network of canals and fields peppered with graceful windmills. This is the premier fishing port in Belgium; the local restaurants offer great seafood.

# The Mediterranean's Celebration of Life

This part of the world draws vitality from its ancient roots.



Mediterranean beauty is at once colorful and refined, rugged and spectacular. Many visitors come to the Mediterranean hoping to see the artifacts of ancient civilizations: the ruins of Rome or Athens, or the glorious art of the Italian Renaissance masters Michelangelo and da Vinci. Yet for all of the region's remnants of long-dead civilizations: the Colosseum, temples and agoras – the Mediterranean is a celebration of life. From the busy Ramblas of Barcelona, to the quiet tavernas of Greece's fishing villages, the origin of Western civilization retains a youthful energy.

Athens, now the premier site for archeology, still inspires through the countless contributions to drama, history, poetry and philosophy of its former residents. Ephesus is another archeological focal point, home to one of the Seven Wonders of the World. The Temple of Artemis catalyzes theories, wonder, and discussion about this former banking and trading center.

Florence, birthplace of the Renaissance and home to so many ancient treasures, continues as a magnet for all that is truly refined and cultured. You'll find the same is true for Livorno, a beautiful Italian seaport, and Messina – these ancient places attract everything that is new and fresh. For all the incredible monuments, historical archives, and theatrical contributions Seville is known for, perhaps the thing that makes this city most famous is the personality and infectious wit of its residents. Places like Madrid and Venice, with awe-

inspiring cathedrals and canals that date back hundreds of years, radiate unexpected timelessness and grace, at peace with the changing world all around them. Like much of the Mediterranean, these places draw you in with Old World comfort and serenity, and then ignite passions of thought, appreciation, and awareness. In short, they make you feel alive.

Mediterranean cuisine is also a celebration of vitality. Although it varies according to country and region, all share a historic tendency toward simple quality. The cuisine takes advantage of bountiful fresh vegetables and clear, distinctive flavors. Dishes tend not to include complex sauces and heavy embellishments, perhaps a reason Mediterranean cuisine, which often features olive oil, seafood, grains, yogurt and nuts, is often synonymous with heart-healthy fare. Dining in the Mediterranean is part hospitality and part social venue and has been that way forever. It's not a place to eat and run, and with food this good, you'll want to take time to appreciate both it and the people you're dining with.

The Mediterranean has truly aged like a fine wine. Beautiful because of its age and experience, but invigorated and best appreciated by youthful celebration. Like the yin and yang personalities of Mykonos and Santorini, Greece, the Mediterranean is even more beautiful because of its richly textured history and simple pleasures.

# Ports of call

## 01 | Ajaccio, Corsica, France

Monuments, avenues, squares, and museums grace this charming city, which fathered one of the greatest conquerors in history. The birthplace of Napoleon Bonaparte is an island of rocky outcroppings and sandy beaches, set on a sunny bay surrounded by citrus groves, olive trees, and vineyards, and bursting with history and cultural diversity.

## 17 | Málaga, Spain

## 20 | Milan, Italy

On a wall of the Monastery of Santa Maria delle Grazie sits one of history's most famous masterpieces, da Vinci's The Last Supper.

## 23 | Nice, France

*(City of Interest)*

The city of Nice is situated at the foot of the Alps. This jewel of the French Riviera is home to some of the world's most luxurious hotels and terraced cafés. Stroll the ultrafamous Promenade des Anglais or see masterpieces by Matisse, Renoir, Monet and Chagall in one of Nice's many museums. Don't miss the onion, anchovy and olive tarts known as pissaladières.

**Excursions include:** Nice & Cannes on Your Own, and Monte Carlo & Grand Casino.

## 15 | Lisbon, Portugal

Lisbon has earned its title as capital of Portugal. See why this city stands out above all others you stroll along elaborate mosaic sidewalks and pass by the Monument to the Discoveries. A quick trolley ride transports you to the cobblestone district of Baixa. Or, if you choose, be lured away and pampered in the resort cities of Cascais and Estoril.

**Excursions include:** Sintra & Cascais, Fatima on Your Own, and Sintra by Bicycle.

## 18 | Marseille/Provence, France

Marseille is sometimes referred to as France's "New Orleans" because of its uniqueness and independent personality. About twice the size of Paris, it's an ancient city that is currently an active international scene. You'll want to visit the Vieux Port, the colorful old harbor.

## 21 | Mykonos, Greece

Described as a bare island bathed in sunlight, Mykonos is known for its immaculately whitewashed villages sprinkled with blue and jade green. It's also famous for its sophisticated nightlife. The most popular island in the Cyclades is bustling with activity, stuffed full of beautiful alleyways, and home to alluring sandy beaches.

**Excursions include:** Ancient Delos.

## 24 | Odessa, Ukraine

*(City of Interest)*

A relatively new country, it's nonetheless rich with a long history. You'll see it in the beautiful buildings and monuments, including an impressive brass statue in honor of the great poet, Pushkin, who once lived in Odessa. You also won't want to miss the Odessa Opera and Ballet House, one of the most beautiful theatres in the world.

## 25 | Palermo (Sicily), Italy

## 34 | Venice, Italy

(Departure Port)

## 35 | Vigo, Spain

(City of Interest)

El Sireno, a gilded sculpture depicting a figure that is half man, half sea creature, towers over the city's lovely gardens and well-preserved historical buildings. The legendary black salts offshore on the Islas Cies are said to bring good health. Catholic pilgrims flock to the nearby sacred cathedral of Santiago de Compostela, built over the burial spot of St. James.

## 27 | Piraeus, Greece

(Gateway Port to Athens, Greece)

Your adventure in Athens begins five miles southwest in Greece's largest seaport, Piraeus. While here, be sure to take notice of what is considered to be one of the greatest contributions from the Age of Pericles – the city's infrastructure, which we know as a city block.

## 30 | Rome, Italy

(City of Interest)

Once the center of the ancient world from which emperors ruled over nearly all of western civilization, Rome is still a cultural mecca. Stroll the ancient halls of the Colosseum or gaze upon the ceilings of the Sistine Chapel. The Pilgrims left for the New World through the maze of narrow streets and alleys of the Barbican. Today, you'll find an antique-lover's paradise in this historic heart of Plymouth. Take in the magnificent views across Plymouth Sound at the Hoe, where Sir Francis Drake is believed to have played bowls before his assault on the Spanish Armada.

## 14|St. John's, Newfoundland

Although it is one of the oldest cities in North America, present-day St. John's has a cosmopolitan feel, bursting with color and life. Its landscape is beautiful, with steep, crowded hillsides and a deep harbor carved from granite. A night on the town wouldn't be complete without a visit to George Street, the perfect place for a pub-crawl and live music.

## 16|Tenerife (Canary Islands)

Spain The largest Canary Island is dominated by 12,198-foot Mount Teide. The cuisine features locally grown fruits (banana, mango and papaya) and fresh fish. Clean, sandy beaches offer chances for windsurfing, surfing, snorkeling and diving. You'll find everything from lush vegetation to uninhibited nightlife in Tenerife.

## 13|Ponta Delgada, Azores

The peaks of a vast underwater volcanic mountain range, Ponta Delgada is considered by many to be the most important city in the Portuguese Azores. Volcanic craters, gardens, and lakes abound in this beautiful city on the island of Sao Miguel. Experience a culinary delight in the sugar beet, Ponta Delgada's most famous export.

**Excursions include:** Village of Sete Cidades & Wine Tasting, Furnas Valley with Lunch, and Fire Lake & Ribeira Grande

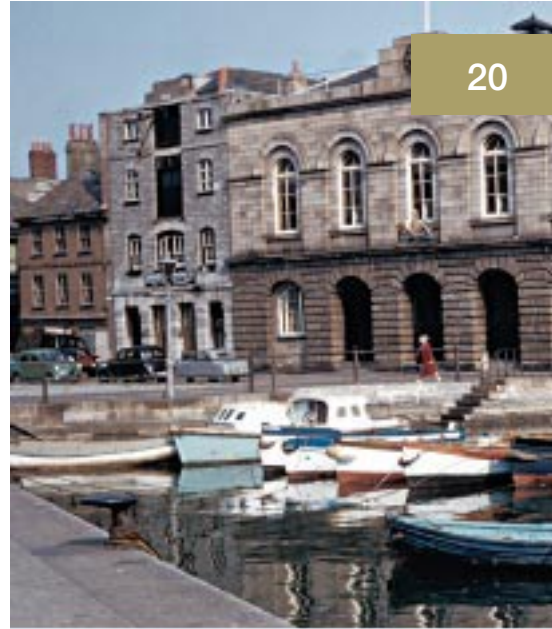
## 15|San Juan, Puerto Rico

## 04 | Halifax, Nova Scotia

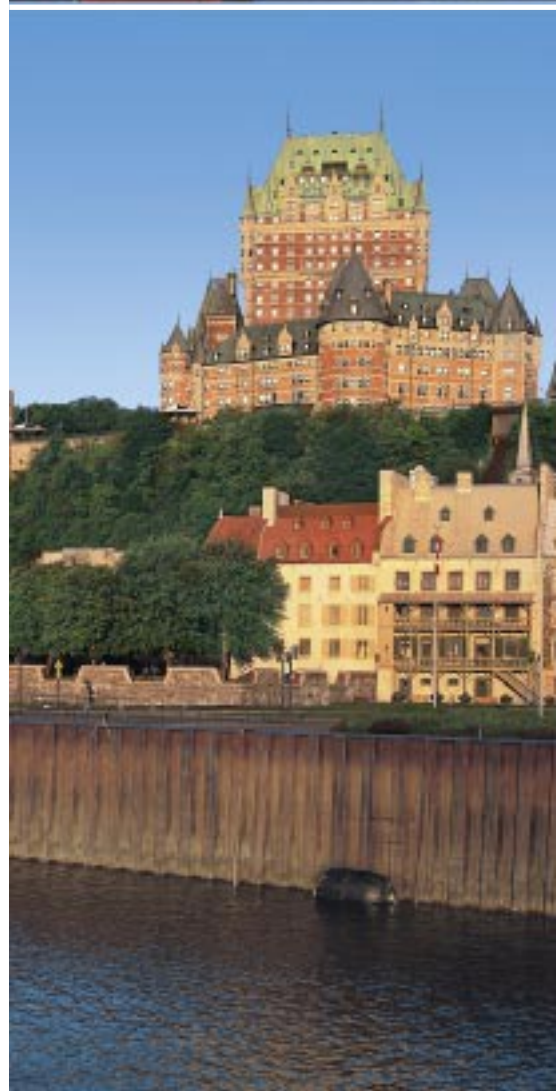
