

#### o1 Ensenada, Mexico

The Riviera Pacifica, with the Bar of the Seven Sins, boasts a colorful past as the former playground of California gentry and movie stars. Festive shops and a former prison that now serves as an Aztec museum are just a couple of the other highlights of this Baja Peninsula favorite.

#### 04|Kailua-Kona, Hawaii




